There is no better time to visit Corryong than during the annual bush gathering, when the small township comes alive with the history of its unique bush traditions.

This year we are celebrating our 25th anniversary of our festival in its modern form.

Corryong is the undiscovered treasure of the Snowys with an event that has something for everyone.

The festival showcases the lifestyle that country folk take for granted. From the many amazing bush poets, artists and photographers to the dust busting action from the fantastic horsemen and women, the festival attracts thousands of outback and city wanderers from all walks of life.

The Man from Snowy River Challenge, art and photography exhibition, bush poetry and music, re-enactment of Banjo's famous poem, Aussie Bush Idol and Ute Muster have grown to be events listed on calendars all over Australia.

For bush poetry fans, you really should have a look at what happens at the Lions Youth Hall and Banjo's Block base camp.

Excellent performers have travelled from all over Oz to help us celebrate our 25th iconic festival - including Geoffrey W Graham, The Rhymer from Ryde, Campbell the Swaggie, Christine Middleton, Tim Sheed, Greg North, Peter Klein, Kevin McCarthy, Matt Hollis, Rhonda Tallnash, Trevor Best and Bonza Blokes Bush Band.

Guy McLean might even be able to drop some bush poetry in between his horse events.

There will be no Victorian Championships this year, which will leave room on the program for walk-up poets and singers to help us showcase poems, yarns and songs from our many past performers such as Frank Daniel, Milton Taylor and Carol Reffold.

We also have our own Man From Snowy River Recital competition (round one judged pre-festival) and the three finalists will recite Banjo's famous poem at 6pm on Friday night at Banjo's Block, the poets' home base.

The second competition is the Jack Riley Heritage Award to be held on Saturday afternoon to find the best song, poem or yarn about


the Upper Murray, high country, Jack Riley or Banjo Paterson.

The third competition is the Carol Reffold Memorial One Minute Poem on Sunday at 1.30pm

Geoffrey Graham 'becomes Banjo Paterson' with glimpses of his character and life. Geoffrey has been reviving the ghost of Banjo at Corryong since the first bush festival in 1995, enthusing many poets and fans to delve deeper into the poet's works.

We hope you'll join us for bouts of bush poetry and music, starting each day with Poets' Breakfasts at 8am on Banjo's Block, with concerts and finishing with a campfire singalong in a friendly atmosphere of camaraderie all weekend.

After a tough year of bushfires and coronavirus lockdowns, causing the cancellation of the 2020 Man From Snowy River Bush Festival, Corryong is ready to host another entertaining and successful event.

The bush festival proudly celebrates our Aussie bush heritage for four days in the heart of the high country and the showcase event this year will be the 25th running of the MFSR Challenge.

The entertainment features musical acts on the live stage, headlined by The Bonza Blokes and extends to a fraternity of highly talented bush poets, artists and photographers through to the dust busting action of the rodeo on

This year's event will mark 25 years since the inception of the festival in

its current format.

The iconic Man From Snowy River Challenge will once again be the main attraction, where more than 60 of the country's highest calibre of riders come together to compete for the ultimate accolade.

Local horseman, John Mitchell, is shooting for four titles after a hat trick from 2016-18 and is likely to have keen competition from his brother and former champion, David. Former junior winner, Jim Laverty, is returning from WA for this year's event and other notable locals are Wendy Sheather, Anna Paton and Brad Pierce.

Reigning champion, Kieran Davidson, will be defending his title and

dual junior winner, Scott Bandy, the son of five-time champ Scott Bandy, will compete at senior level for the first time.

In the women's division, Emma O'Shea will be striving for an amazing seventh consecutive victory.

The festival pays homage to 'Banjo' Paterson's Man From Snowy River poem in a live re-enactment, with crowds watching 'in very fear' as mountain horsemen take on the steep and winding mountains in pursuit of 'the colt that got away'.

The dust busting action of the rodeo on Saturday evening showcases the best rough stock the country has to offer.

The festival will also

feature a ute muster, kids party, street parade, bush markets, Aussie bush idol, bushman's whip crack competition and working cattle dog championships.

Unfortunately, Covid restrictions, the popular street parade cannot be held this year.

"The authentic and unique nature of our festival, the spectacular scenery, the and high calibre of competition, entertainment and friendly locals are the fundamentals that bring thousands of wanderers to our little town, Corryong,' said festival co-ordinator, Jenny Boardman.



Relive 'The Man's' epic ride



The Man From Snowy River Bush Festival is proud to again present the stirring re-enactment of Banjo Paterson's iconic poem at Thowgla on Friday (follow the signs from the western end of town).

The re-enactment of Banjo's famous poem 'The Man From Snowy River', is located in the Thowgla Valley with the mountains as the backdrop and the stage is set for an event not to be missed.

Unfortunately, due to Covid restrictions there will only be one performance this year.

The re-enactment pays tribute to the men, women and horses of the past.

Bring your chair, sit back, relax and enjoy the pre-performance entertainment as the early settlers set up camp in their summer mountain hut.

Gates open at 8am and Guy McLean and his bullock team will entertain the crowd. At 11am Khancoban Station's Riley's Ride® group is welcomed, as the horsemen and women arrive from their epic journey.

The ride traces the last journey of legendary Upper Murray stockman, Jack Riley, who reportedly met Banjo Paterson in 1890 and is locally regarded as the inspiration for his famous ballad.

It is held to commemorate Jack Riley's life and the part he played in the early days of this district and also to laud the efforts of those who selflessly sought to rescue him under

harsh conditions.

After their arrival, the iconic poem then comes to life with an exceptional display of mountain horsemanship with the show beginning at 11.30am.

Jack Riley is buried at Corryong Cemetery and a granite headstone has been erected in his memory.

In 1995 the Upper Murray celebrated the centenary of the publication of Paterson's 'The Man from Snowy River and Other Verses' with a festival which has developed into an internationally renowned event.

Retracing 'The Man's last ride



More than 40 riders have rolled their swags and saddled up and are currently making their way from Tom Groggin Station, through the spectacular scenery of the Snowy Mountains and down to Corryong in time for the 2021 Bush Festival.

Known as 'Riley's Ride' the event is an essential element of the bush festival.

It traces the last journey of legendary Upper Murray stockman, Jack Riley, who reportedly met Banjo Paterson at his mountain hut in 1890 and is locally regarded as the inspiration for Paterson's famous ballad.

This annual ride is held to commemorate Jack Riley's life and the part he played in the early days of this district and also to laud the efforts of those who selflessly sought to rescue him under harsh and trying conditions.

ride offers spectacular views and the chance to meet people from far and wide, many which hail from different walks of life but share a love of the Australian bush and horses as well as deep respect for the pioneering families of the area.

It is a challenging ride and a character building experience, so congratulations go to the riders and organisers for another fantastic year.

Over the four day trek riders travel on average about 30kms a day and spend between five and eight hours in the saddle each day.

With a recent string of accolades including two ARIA nominations and two CMAA Golden Guitar awards, Fanny Lumsden is taking her music to the new levels.

Fanny and her husband have clocked up thousands of kilometres driving all over Australia selling out their Annual Country Halls Tour, playing shows in more than 100 towns.

In January 2019, Blake O'Connor became the 40th winner of Toyota Star Maker – Australia's longest running and most prestigious country music competition.



Wandering minstrel swaps scenes



From forensic police crime scene investigator to award-winning singersongwriter, Kevin Sullivan, has made his mark on the Australian country music scene.

Kevin's unique fusion of storytelling and his captivating country sound excites audiences with his brass arsenal, bringing that big band country feel back into country music.

This is shaping up to be another big year for Kevin and he's excited to be back again performing and entertaining crowds.

In November 2020, Kevin and his family - wife Belinda and three young children KJ (11), Cha Cha (9) and Jet (5) - commenced their tour around Australia which is sponsored by Sunland Caravans which has launched a family caravan called the 'Sulli-Van'.

The tour started in Queensland and The 'Sulli-Vans' have been taking their music to the communities and towns across the country.

While on tour, Kevin teamed up to play a show with the legendary Gina Timms at the Moolooloba Surf Club In January 2021 and also joined Col Finley

on Australia Day 2021 to perform at a winery in Maleny.

Kevin said "We are loving being on tour in our Sunland 'Sulli-Van' which will conclude with two major festivals - the iconic 'Man from Snowy River Festival with Troy Cassar Daly and Casey Barnes and The Big Country Festival in Berry, NSW.

The single from Kevin's recently released album is a duet co-written with the legendary Bill Chambers and tells a story about the high country horsemen of Victoria. The music video for the duet was filmed around Craigs Hut near Merrijig, Victoria.

It's been four years since Kevin fulfilled a lifelong dream which began in Tamworth and culminated with Kevin travelling to Nashville to record songs for his second album with award-winning producer, Matt Fell.

Kevin's new album ise a reflection of his personal growth and soul over the last five years where chapters have closed and new doors opened. The imagery and sounds evoked in Kevin Sullivan's songs, transports listeners both physically and emotionally, as they deeply connect with him as a singer-song writer and become enchanted by his tone, rhythmic beat and fusion of brass, drums and percussion as you hear his influences of Paul Kelly, Bruce Springsteen and Johnny Cash.

Following the success of the first leg of the 'Sulli-Van' tour, Kevin will hit the road again in June this year, heading back to Queensland for some ticketed shows with Gina Timms and Alan Caswell and then playing the iconic Oodies Café, Bundaberg and continuing north.

Kevin was a finalist for Single and Male vocalist of the Year for his song 'Outback Australia' at the Southern Star Awards at Mildura.

He also co-hosts a monthly country music segment on ABC Illawarra with Nick Rheinberger and also a presents a regular Forensic Police Crime Scene segment.

He is also an Ambassador for Cupid's Undie Run a charity raising money for the Children's Tumour Foundation for Neurofibromatosis awareness and treatment.

Riders vie for legend status



They can crack whips, shoe horses, catch brumbies and ride like The Man From Snowy River - and they assemble in Corryong every autumn to battle for the title as the best stockman (or woman) in the country.

Challenge competitors will take part in demanding tests of skill including a vet and gear check, stock handling, packhorse, bareback obstacle riding, horseshoeing and cross country riding.

Only the top ten competitors will take part in the daring final events - brumby catching (pictured) and stocksaddle buckjumping.

These will determine who will leave Corryong with the prestigious Modern Man from Snowy River title. There is also a Junior and Ladies section as well as a Striplings Challenge.

All Challenge events take place at the Corryong Showgrounds, beginning on the Friday with the preliminary rounds being held over two days. The finals take place on Sunday beginning with the Junior section at 12 noon.
